RICHARD ASHBY – MILLER, FARMER AT HAWKWELL, PEMBURY INCLUDING CONNECTIONS TO WESTFIELD, SUSSEX

Jane Grooms

Richard Ashby was born in 1795 in Heathfield, Sussex. He died on the 21 February, 1880 in Hawkwell, Pembury, Kent.

He was a miller at *Spring Grove Water Mill* and a farmer at Hawkwell, Pembury for many years.

Richard married Jane Tyhurst (born circa 1800, died 1888), in Westfield, Sussex on 18 March, 1820.

He was one of the witnesses to the second marriage of Stephen Crisford to Ann Woodhurst in 1833 in St Peter's Church, Pembury (lower church). Stephen Crisford was a miller in Westfield, Sussex and his first wife had been Elizabeth Tyhurst, Aunt of Richard Ashby's wife, Jane.

Richard Ashby is shown as *occupier* of various plots owned by Woodgate and Briscoe [the Woodgate family] including the following plots:

- 650 "Farm and Buildings"
- 651 "Cottage and Land"
- 652 "Orchard"
- 657 "Coach House Meadow"

This area of land is close to where Great Hawkwell Manor once stood.

Other plots occupied by Richard Ashby describe the land as being used for Arable farming including Hops.

PEMBURY.

SAD CASE OF SUDDEN DEATH.—On Saturday last Mr. Richard Ashby, a retired gentleman 85 years of age, living at Hawkwell, Pembury, died suddenly under the following circumstances. He had been for his usual merning's walk, and about eleven o'clock was speaking to a neighbour, and telling him that he thought the walk had been too much for him, when he fell down in the road, and died in a few minutes before any assistance could be rendered. The deceased, who was highly respected, was for many years a member of the Tonbridge Board of Juardians, and was present at their meeting on the previous day. Mr. Joseph Rogers, the coroner, was communicated with, but did not, under the origination of the an inquest necessary.

GEORGE ASHBY (1823 to 1911) - son of Richard Ashby

Richard and Jane had several children one of which, George Ashby became a farmer eventually taking over from his father, Richard when Richard retired. It appears George retired not long after the death of his father and moved to Preston, Brighton, Sussex.

FREDERICK ASHBY (1828 – 1902) – second eldest son of Richard Ashby

Frederick is included because he is recorded as a mill employee at Spring Grove Mill/Great Hawkwell Farm in the household of his father, Richard Ashby in the **1851 Census**. From the **1861 census** onwards, Frederick is no longer in Pembury but in Camberwell and later Lewisham as a Hop Factor and Brewer. The **1881 census** records him at Home Park, Lewisham, London, England.
